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COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Fundamentals of Art course introduces students to the elements of art and principles of design. Students will learn basic drawing skills, and techniques that are utilized with different mediums. You will also learn about art history and how to critique each other's work. We will cover both two-dimensional and three-dimensional design.

COURSE MATERIALS NEEDED

1" Binder - All students MUST purchase a 1" binder for the course. (Dollar Store/Shoprite) All art students are required to maintain a sketchbook, which may include drawings, sketches, notes and exercises.

CURRICULUM & COURSE CONTENT

I use Google Classroom and my website heavily. Google Classroom will hold day by day links, but the website will hold everything pertaining to the course. **All mid-work processes will need to be uploaded to Google Classroom in order to be graded; follow the Art Process. Final Projects will be handed in for a grade.** Rubrics and other supplemental information will be available on the information table.

TEST GRADES

All art projects that you complete will be graded and scored under the TEST category. For every art project we begin you will receive vocabulary words, history, artists, materials, checklists, rubrics, etc.

QUIZ GRADES

All units will have a small quiz. They are graded using a point system. These will all be done online.

HOMEWORK GRADES

On occasion a NewsELA/EdPuzzle article will be given to you, you **MUST** complete the quiz, your quiz grade is your grade for the assignment.

SKETCHBOOKS: These are your daily warm-ups and observational drawings due weekly and uploaded to Google Classroom. These are to be done the first 5-10 minutes at the beginning of each class or when you need a change of pace, or have completed your main assignment. They are meant to be used as supplemental and not a lesson. All units have a set of sketchbook activities. All worksheets handed out are expected to be placed into the sketchbook for further reference.

PARTICIPATION GRADES

Each unit has its own Participation Grade that follows a rubric. That rubric is attached so you can see how to keep your participation grade up. Follow the next guidelines and receive an easy 3pts each day through ClassDojo.

1. **CLEAN UP:** Each day as an individual student you are given a point. If your table and area are left the way it was found, you receive a point-if not; no point.
2. **CLASS PARTICIPATION:** On your phone, not listening, talking during instruction all take points off each day. Pay attention and work.
3. **ONLINE PARTICIPATION:** You keep up with your Google Classroom Assignments and post for all Design phases; Plan and Research (Phase 1), Design and Refine (Phase 2) and Create (Phase 3).

MIDTERM/FINAL EXAM

MID-TERM: You will be using Socrative for your midterm, it will be a simple vocabulary test.

FINAL: You will be using Socrative for your final, it will be a vocabulary test for ALL vocabulary learned during the semester, you will also have a final project.

LATE WORK

Projects and other assignments will not be accepted after 5 days late. Your time/effort grade will drop one full letter grade for each day it is late. A zero will be given after five days. The only exception to this is if you are absent. Full credit will be given if make-up work is turned in as the same number of days you were absent.

MAKE-UP WORK

It is your responsibility to find out what work you missed. Check the website, and/or a trusted classroom neighbor for missing work. You must turn in completed work on time. ***It is your responsibility. I will not go around the room looking for work on the drying rack.***

Research Paper

If you are failing the ONLY way to bring your grade up is by doing a 250 word research paper on any artist and an inspired artwork on your OWN TIME.

REWARDS This year I will be implementing a Pocket Points reward system. Before we get started with the rewards system you will choose the rewards you would like to have. Pocket Points rewards students for staying off their phone during the school day. Stay off your phone the entire class and earn 90 minutes worth of points, use them anyway you like. Maybe you need 5 pts extra for that quiz

you failed, maybe you need a day off, a homework pass, you name it we will configure it during the first week of school.

Student Policies & Procedures

● Homeroom

- You will arrive in the room on time.
 - Walking in after the bell will result in being marked late and referred to the office for discipline
 - Not showing up on time but being shown as present will result in automatic CUT. Do not go to shop first and call me. It will show as a CUT!
- You will be in your seats and quiet for the flag salute and announcements.
 - Schools rules and state of New Jersey law dictates you will stand for the pledge and may remain silent if you so choose.






